The 2nd Annual Slow Spokes' Little Miami Scenic Trail Bike Ride September 13, 14, 15, and 16, 2000

Encouraged by your overwhelming, positive response to the Slow Spokes Seven Little Miami Scenic Trail Bike Ride review in the November 1999 Spoken Times, we have scheduled the Slow Spokes' 2nd Annual Little Miami Scenic Trail Bike Ride for Wednesday, September 13, 2000 to Saturday, September 16, 2000.

This three-night-four-day trip will allow ample time for canoeing, hiking and sightseeing for those who choose to do so.

Since the trail is sheltered, relatively flat, approximately twelve feet wide and seventy miles long, this might be a perfect opportunity for those of us who haven't done a Century to attain that goal on one of the four days.

The Xenia Old Fashioned Days Festival and the Jamestown Bean Festival (a fifteen minute drive from Xenia) will both take place that weekend and should be fun places to visit Friday night and on Saturday before departing for Toledo and Tony Packo's restaurant. The festivals feature: a parade, local and national entertainment, food, crafts, a balloon glow, paddle boat rides, a field day, an auction, and a garden-tractor pull.

Since both of these festivals will attract a large number of visitors, those who are not camping might consider reserving motel rooms now. But, check with the reservation clerks to be sure you could cancel if necessary.

The two motels located in downtown Xenia are: (1) The Holiday Inn (937) 372-9921 and The Best Western Regency Inn (937) 372-9954. Both motels have a AAA two star rating with rates ranging from \$50.00 to \$90.00 for two persons-two beds accommodations. Both properties are located within one mile of The Little Miami Scenic Trail.

The Alpha House Bed and Breakfast is located in nearby Alpha, Ohio. You may contact the owners, Bob and Jackie Johnson, at 1-800-337-2852 for particulars.

We have reserved camping facilities at the luxurious but rustic Xenia Fairgrounds. The rates will be basically the same as this year, less than five dollars per person. If you plan to drive a camper or RV to the site, the rate for water and electrical hook up is ten dollars per night.

More detailed information with departure times, specific directions to Xenia, and a suggested daily itinerary will be available in late spring or early summer for those members who express an interest in this ride.

Since the rate for the camp site is determined by the number of tents, we would need to have an estimate of the number planning to tent. When we provide the number of tents to be set up, the Xenia Fairgrounds representative will give us the exact cost.
