# SLOW SPOKES WANTS <u>YOU!</u> TO BE A RIDE LEADER!!

Most club members ride in their own neighborhoods and know the area well. If you can stretch that ride to 15-20 miles, you have a perfect route for a slow-paced (10-12 mph), easy ride for beginners and intermediates. If you prefer bike paths, there are Metroparkway, Paint Creek, Lower Huron Metroparks and several others you may know of. The leader sets the meeting place, time, and distance to ride – nothing to it!

Early Sunday mornings are the best times for rides: low traffic and cool temps. Later Sunday mornings or afternoons are good too, especially in cooler weather. Saturday mornings are fine, and with all our retired members, mid-week rides are popular. Pick a time and place that suits you and you'll find others happy to join you.

Experienced leaders can help by asking neophytes to co-lead with them. First-timers can ask a veteran to ride sweep. If we all cooperate, we should be able to double our number of ride leaders and increase the number of rides we offer.

Our season begins April 1 and runs through November. We need at least 100 rides to fill our calendar. Start planning now for one or two (or more) rides you will lead this year.

A committee will be appointed to incorporate your suggestions in the revision.

We are fortunate to live and ride in an area where there is a great deal of Rail-Trail conversion activity. Dave Rumohr, club member and Friends of the Macomb Orchard Trail (MOT) Director, will update us on the progress of the MOT at the February meeting. I hope to have a representative of the Polly Ann Trail (PAT) do the same at the March meeting.

### SLOW SPOKES OF MACOMB, INC. BY-LAWS

Article I -- Name:

The name of this organization shall be the Slow Spokes of Macomb, Inc. The principal place of business shall be Macomb County, Michigan. The club shall maintain a post office box.

Article II -- Colors:

The official colors of the club shall be orange with an auxiliary color of black.

### Article III -- Aims and Goals of the Club:

1. To promote the general interests of cycling in all of its phases.

2. To encourage and facilitate all forms of bicycling.

- 3. To defend and protect the rights of bicyclists.
- 4. To secure a better understanding and recognition of the need for safer riding conditions.
- 5. To cooperate with public authorities in the observance of all traffic regulations.
- 6. To promote better bicycle facilities.

<u> Article IV -- Membership:</u>

Anyone interested in bicycling is eligible for membership. Those under 18 years of age must be accompanied by an adult during all club activities and rides.

Article V -- Fiscal Year:

The club's fiscal year shall be December 1st through November 30th.

Article VI -- Dues:

The membership shall set the dues, for the next year, by a majority vote prior to the end of the fiscal year. If such a vote is not taken then the previous year's dues shall be in effect for another year. Dues shall be paid prior to the beginning of the month of April.

Article VII -- Officers:

The following officers and directors shall be elected by the membership, at the election meeting, and shall serve a one-year term of office.

President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer,

Newsletter Editor, Membership Chairman.

The Peach of Ride Chairman shall be appointed by the Board of Directors and shall be a member of the Executive Board. These officers shall constitute the Executive Board to govern the club, subject to the approval of the membership.

Article VIII -- Elections:

Elections of the club officers shall be held annually at the November meeting. A nominating committee appointed by the president shall present a list of candidates for the offices to be filled. Additional names may be placed in nomination from the floor immediately prior to the election. A majority vote of the members present shall be necessary to elect. Installation of the officers elected shall take place at the first regular meeting following the elections.

Article IX -- Committees:

The Executive Board may appoint committees as deemed necessary.

Article X -- Meetings:

Regular meetings shall be held each month.

Article XI -- Amendments and Adoption:

Amendments to these by-laws may be proposed by any club member and may be incorporated, if approved by a majority vote of members present at a regular membership meeting.
