<u>Wednesday, September 1, 2004, 6:00 pm</u> <u>Wednesday Wramble</u>
Leader: Bob Bruce (248) 641-5139, distance 18-22 miles, pace 13-15, terrain flat to rolling. Dual paced ride. Kathy George will lead a slower, shorter ride. Meet at NE corner of Livernois and Long Lake. Park next to AAA office, facing Long Lake. Optional restaurant stop after ride.

<u>Saturday, September 4, 2004, 10:00 am</u> <u>Lexington Lakeshore Ride</u>
Leader: Paul Wilhelm (586) 247-6397, distance 45+ miles, pace 12-14, terrain mostly flat with a few moderate grades. Meet in Lexington in the parking lot at the foot of Simons Street. Take I-94 to M-25 to Lexington. One block past the light, turn right on Simons Street. Ride through the villages/towns of Port Sanilac, Forester, Carsonville, Applegate, and the "Be Good to Your Mother-in-law" swinging bridge in Croswell. Optional restaurant stop after ride.

Sunday, September 5, 2004, 10:00 am Off the beaten path in NW Detroit and Suburbs

Leader: Phil LaRonge (586) 758-0416, distance about 40 miles, pace 12-14, terrain mostly flat but with short steep hills in unexpected places. Meet behind Fitzgerald High School on Bart St. and Ryan Rd. in Warren. 1 block north of 9 mile on the southeast corner. Park behind school auditorium on Bart. A ride through northwest Detroit and adjoining suburbs. Points of interest include the fine residential areas along W. Outer Drive, the historic Brightmoor and Old Redford sections of Detroit, and a ride through the remote, little-known residential areas along the rolling banks of the Rouge River that I discovered over 40 years ago as a kid moseying around on my old Evans cruiser. We'll also go through some of the nicer parts of Southfield, Huntington Woods, and other north area communities. A pleasant and interesting time is guaranteed for all on Labor Day weekend! No ride if it rains. Restaurant stop - Taco Bell on 8 Mile near Berg Rd.

Wednesday, September 8, 2004, 6:00 pm Wednesday Wramble
Leader: Bob Bruce (248) 641-5139, distance 18-22 miles, pace 13-15, terrain flat to rolling. Dual paced ride. Kathy George will lead a slower, shorter ride. Meet at NE corner of Livernois and Long Lake. Park next to AAA office, facing Long Lake. Optional restaurant stop after ride.

Saturday, September 11, 2004, 10:00 am Lower Huron Metroparks Trail Ride
