In these tough economic times, we have had to implement some changes to make this event more fiscally sound. While we have not had to increase the entry fee for the ride, it is necessary to ask all Slow Spokes members who are not volunteering their time and effort to the event and wish to ride to pay the pre-registration entry fee of \$20.00 per person. In addition volunteer workers will not be given t-shirts, Club mem-

bers can purchase t-shirts and/or sweatshirts at Club cost of \$5.00 and \$10.00 respectively. T-shirts/ sweatshirts will be available for purchase at the Sept. 7 meeting. We are convinced these changes will make the POAR more financially successful.

Finally I'd like to thank Kim, Concetta, the committee chairs and all of the volunteers for their efforts to make the 2007 Peach of a Ride one of the best ever. If you are not working on the ride (We still need a few more volunteers. See Kim or Concetta.), I strongly encourage you to come out to Memphis and ride the POAR. You'll have a great time and be very proud to be a Slow Spoke.

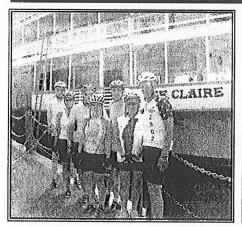

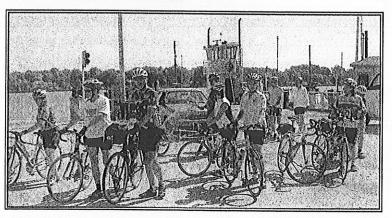
